Hello everyone,

Welcome to the next fiscal year of this Kalamazoo Garden Council. Do all of you know how unusual this organization is? Founded in 1946, our Council is the only one of its kind in the state. Many other communities have vibrant garden clubs, of course, which beautify and provide valuable information about culture, landscaping, and ecological concerns to their residents. The Kalamazoo area, though, is the only location that can boast a decades-long choice to share information, programming, and projects AMONG our separate garden clubs for the betterment of all of us in greater Kalamazoo. The Kalamazoo Garden Council does this through its Directors, one representative from each garden club, who, with the Council's elected officers and six committee chairs, sit on the Council board to coordinate the organization's activities.

This year we are trying something new: each monthly Council meeting will be led by a different Director, rotating alphabetically through the roster, with Council business coordinated by the President between meetings. This decision was voted on by the Council Board in April, 2023 since no candidate stepped up to assume the traditional role of President. How this will work? Each Director will preside over one Council meeting. It is the Director's responsibility to find a substitute from her club or trade with another Director if she cannot preside on her assigned month.

The presiding Director's job during her month is:

1. Attend the Executive Committee meeting at 9:30 a.m. the first Tuesday of the month to create the agenda with the planning team, bringing anything forward that may have been communicated to her earlier by another member or Council Director.

- any standing committee chairs who have business to bring up at the monthly Board Meeting

A finalized agenda will be emailed to the presiding Director for that month, as well as all other Directors, in advance of the meeting. Agenda itemd that will require a motion, second, and a vote will be highlighted.

2. Preside over the Council Board Meeting the second Tuesday of her month at 9:30 a.m. following the agenda in order. Bunny LaDuke will handle tech issues with Zoom.

3. Keep the meeting moving, following Roberts Rules procedures, with assistance from the President and/ or Parliamentarian if requested.

from Ample Pantry were eaten in a pavilion overlooking the Detroit River and Canada on the other side.
