# GREENS SALE 2023 UPDATE

KGC held its 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary Greens Sale at the beautiful Portage Zhang Senior Center on December 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2023 and it was a wonderful event! The weather, though cold, was perfect for shoppers and workers alike. A little rain didn't seem to faze the community because shopping was brisk. KGC members worked together like a well-oiled machine from set-up on Thursday afternoon to cleanup on Saturday evening.

It takes awhile for final net profits to be counted. Why? Because we wait for reimbursements to be turned in, checks to clear, and loose ends to be reconciled. However, preliminary numbers indicate a net profit of about \$19,500, which is about \$2,300 less than the 2022 sale. # **Louise Adams Beautification**

The Louise Adams Beautification Award encourages member garden clubs to actively be involved in civic beautification projects within the community. The award money (up to \$200 per club) helps compensate the clubs for plant materials used in the projects, as well as equipment necessary in maintaining the area.

This years' award winners were:

Burke View Garden Club continues to supply



birdseed to Kairos Dwelling and this year began work at Grace Valley Assisted Living on Douglas Avenue.

The scope of the project included flowers,

mulch, and general cleanup of the property.



Chula Vista Garden Club purchased and



planted more perennial plants in the Plainwell/Otsego gardens to minimize time and cost for annuals in their gardens. In Otsego the gardens include the North Farmer Street Pollinator Garden and the South Farmer Street Blue Star Memorial Garden.

In Plainwell there are two gardens on the corner of Acorn Street and the M-89 Industrial Park, an Art Sculpture Garden (*pictured at right*), and a Blue Star Memorial Garden.



**Kalamazoo Garden Club** for their "Welcome to Kalamazoo Northside Neighborhood" sign, also known as the North Gateway to the city. The 2023 plantings included yellow and orange canna lilies, lantana, and million bells which created the hot colors this summer. Mums were added in the fall.



<u>Westwood Garden Club</u> continues their work at the Veterans Memorial at Riverside Cemetery on Gull Road. This years' expenses included a round of flags, lights, mulch, and spraying for ants and weeds. The handicap ramp is now completed which allows disabled Veterans access to the Memorial.



The total of all receipts came to \$2,143.16 with the total payout to clubs equaling \$768.20. GREAT JOB GARDENERS!!
