Again this year, the annual Greens Sale heralds the joyous holiday season enabling homemakers far and near to gather all supplies needed to dress their homes in Christmas finery.

Sponsored by the Kalamazoo Garden Council, 500 members in 21 federated clubs, this year's sale again will be staged in Lilac Cottage, 616 Locust.

Sale hours will be from noon to 8 p.m. on Wednesday, Dec. 7 and from noon to 4 p.m. on Thursday, Dec. 8.

General chairman is Mrs. Lester A. Forsman and now taking special orders are Mrs. John M. Jarboe, 2659 Sunnybrook Drive, and Mrs. Fred W. Staten, 2727 Brooke Drive.

As usual, freshly-cut pine will be the big sale item. There also will be decorated and plain fresh green wreaths, pine cone wreaths, kissing bal's, symbolic straw wreaths, decorated hearth brooms, live terrariums, antiqued ceramic and wood candle-holders.

Holly from Oregon will be available, as will be door, mantle and table arrangements; corn husk roses, dried artichokes, candles, ribbon, artificial fruits, stemmed ornaments and everything needed by the do-it-yourselfer.

This is the 200th publication of *The Garden Post*. The newsletter started as a monthly publication since the Kalamazoo Garden Council's formation in 1946. It is now distributed quarterly. The purpose is to announce valuable information and reminders, upcoming activities of the club and community, and share educational information, picures and tips. We also encourage participation in the activities of the Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc. and the National Garden Clubs, Inc.

The Garden Post is distributed free to our 174 members, the District 3A Director, the MGC State President and 1st Vice President, and shared with prospective members. It is also posted on the Council's website and Facebook page. The number of pages could vary monthly depending on the amount of information to share.

The President and Editor are responsible for publishing the newsletter according to the Council's Bylaws. Norma Stancatti was the editor from 1997-2022. Karla Labby is the current editor with assistance of Co-President Andrea Stork and IT Chair, Kathy Kienle. All clubs and members can submit articles, educational information, photos, and announcements. Local garden organizations such as Kalamazoo in Bloom and the Master Gardeners are also welcome to contribute to our newsletter.

Throughout the Council's 79 year history, the newsletter has been through many transformations in the publication processes. Starting with handwritten, to manual and electric typewriters and "Ditto" machines and now high-speed color copiers. Time and expenses are minimal today because computers and electronic mail are everyday tools of communication. Members who do not have email receive a printed copy from their club. Any expenses incurred are covered by the annual budget. The Garden Post will continue to exist along with the Kalamazoo Garden Council and its member clubs for many more years.
